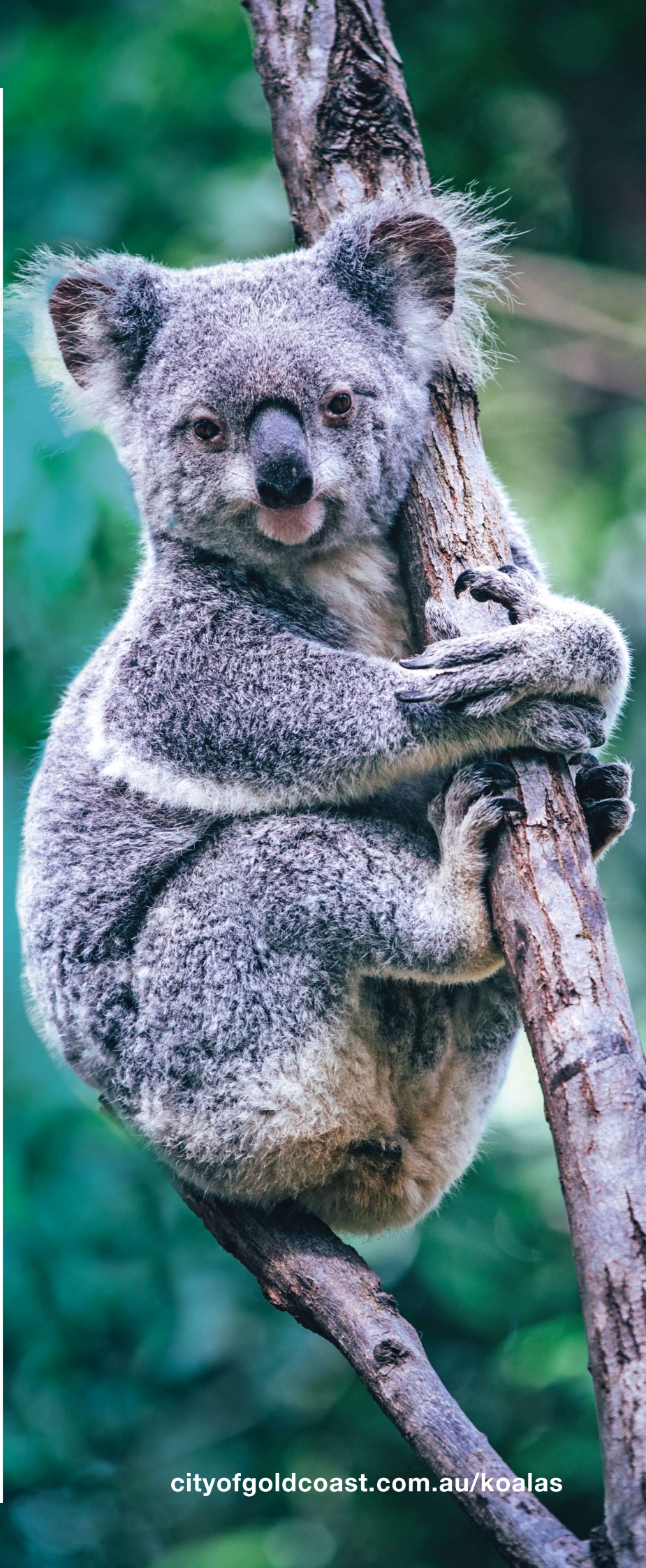

ALL GROUPS AT HOTA – CHOIRS, BANDS & DANCE GROUPS MUST HAVE TWO DELEGATED MARSHALS FOR EACH GROUP WHO WILL ASSIST IN THE FLOW OF THE COMPETITION AND SUPERVISE ENTERING AND EXITING THEIR PERFORMANCE.

WE WILL REQUIRE A LIST OF ALL PARTICIPANTS FOR EACH GROUP PRIOR TO THE EVENT.

DANCE GROUPS – THERE WILL BE NO ACCESS TO 'HOLDING' ROOM FOR PARENTS. THIS AREA IS LIMITED TO PERFORMERS, TEACHERS AND DELEGATED MARSHALS. BAGS ARE TO BE KEPT TO A MINIMUM.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Unless otherwise stated, the Gold Coast Eisteddfod is for amateur performers only i.e. any person who does not derive nor has ever derived his or her main income or a substantial income as a teacher and/or performer in the particular category of performing arts for which he/she wishes to enter.
2. Entries close: May 7, 2021. To assist the office, please submit entries as early as possible online. Online payment will be by PayPal or direct debit.
3. Enter online at www.goldcoasteisteddfod.com.au. For assistance in entering please contact the office mail@goldcoasteisteddfod.com.au
4. It is the responsibility of the entrants, teacher, parent or carer to list the correct section numbers on entry. GCE accepts no responsibility for incorrect entries received.
5. Entry fees are not refundable unless the section is cancelled by GCE.
6. Unless otherwise stated, any item may be performed once only by a competitor.
7. Time limits must be observed. These are the maximum - an item may be shorter than the limit but not exceed it. Should time limits be exceeded, the adjudicator will penalise.
8. GCE reserves the right to cancel, combine or split any section/s.
9. GCE reserves the right to appoint a new adjudicator should it be deemed necessary.
10. Unless there are at least four competitors in a section, only one prize will be awarded, unless the adjudicator decides otherwise.
11. The decision of the adjudicator is final.
12. Prompting, except by an adjudicator is not permitted.
13. Intending competitors who have been pupils of an adjudicator within six months prior to Eisteddfod start date will be ineligible to enter any section judged by the adjudicator. (Workshops/Guest teachers excluded)
14. Unless specifically invited by the adjudicator, contact must not be made directly by teachers, competitors or parents.
15. Mobile phones must be switched off in backstage and change room areas at all venues. No cameras allowed in these areas. The use of mobile phones, cameras and video recorders is prohibited in HOTA – Theatre 1. In other venues, private videoing is permitted only by the parent/representative or teacher of competitor on stage. No photographs during a performance.
16. Any item having to withdraw after entering must notify GCE as soon as possible to ensure smooth programming.
17. Competitors must be present at the beginning of the session as withdrawals may alter the order of appearance. Due to this, it is unwise to anticipate exact performance times.

18. Any protest or objection must be referred to the Convenor of the section within 30 minutes of the Adjudicator's decision. A protest will only be accepted from a competitor, the competitor's teacher or parent and must be received with a \$50 fee. If the complaint is found to be valid, this fee will be refunded. In the case of a dispute arising in respect of the age of any competitor and his/her eligibility to appear in any age grouping, GCE reserves the right to request a copy of the birth certificate of that competitor. Anonymous letters will NOT be considered.
19. Every care will be taken for competitors' safety, but GCE will not be responsible for any injuries sustained by any competitor and or damage to property during the Eisteddfod.
20. Teachers please note - there will be no additions to the program unless the omission is the fault of GCE.
21. GCE has the right to amend the program at any time.
22. Competitors and/or winner's names and/or photographs may be used in the media. Should this not be appropriate the Eisteddfod office MUST BE notified.
23. Failure to comply with any of the rules and regulations may result in disqualification or the withholding of prizes. The decision of GCE on any question or dispute shall be absolutely final.
24. All medals & trophies are provided by the Gold Coast Eisteddfod.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

By agreeing, you automatically grant permission for digital images or photographs to be used for promotional or marketing purposes and/or on social media. If you do not agree, please advise the Eisteddfod office in writing.
- Rules and regulations pertaining to each section are outlined in this Syllabus and will not be repeated in the program. Changes to some rules may occur from year to year, therefore it is imperative that all instructions are read carefully. Disqualification may follow if rules are not observed.
- Time limit is calculated from first note played or 10 seconds after curtain is raised (whichever occurs first) to the last note played including applause between items.
- At the time limit stated, up to 15 seconds may be allowed to conclude the performance – after this time, the house curtain may be brought it. It is NOT essential to play up to the time limit.
- Penalties will be applied by the adjudicator if the performance is over the stated time limit.
- Conductors should select the level of repertoire at the recommended level stated for each Grade which will best showcase this in their performance.
- No student taking part in graded sections will be permitted to play in another grade unless playing a different family of instruments. Percussionists may play in one grade only unless otherwise specified.
- A copy of music must be provided for the adjudicator. Photocopies will be destroyed by GCE.
- No soloists in Concert Band, Orchestra, String Orchestra or Instrument Ensemble sections i.e. No concerto/concerto grosso repertoire.
- To avoid program clashes a conductor must be nominated on entry together with numbers in each ensemble and whether string orchestras are standing or seated.
- To avoid overcrowding on stage or backstage and to facilitate quick changeovers, competitors must use available instruments/equipment where these are provided.

- All electrical requirements, including keyboard, amplifiers and power supplies, need to comply with Queensland Government regulations - i.e. must have current electrical test and tag. Non-compliance will result in the equipment being disallowed.
- For Bands & Orchestras a limit of 70 seated musicians.
- Students must attend the school they represent (unless otherwise stated).
- Directors of groups must arrange for responsible adults with school ID to supervise members inside and outside the theatre.
- Banners will be permitted for front row players only.
- On stage preparation time must not exceed 4 minutes including set up and tuning.
- Competitors must be in their allocated warm up room or allocated seating in the theatre prior to start time of their sections. Performers must stay together as a group for the duration of the session and are not permitted to join parents in the audience seating.
- Instruments or belongings are not be left unattended except in allocated storage areas.
- Teachers please note - withdrawals and events beyond the control of the convenor may affect the running time of sections. All reasonable effort will be made to adhere to the program but the order of appearance may be changed without advance notice at the discretion of the convenor. Please advise parents only the section start time - not anticipated performance time.
- There may be some changes in dates and venues so please carefully check program when received.

STAGE PLANS

PLEASE NOTE: STAGE PLANS ARE NOT REQUIRED - Except for Sections B001, B002, B013, B014

(Instrumental and String Ensembles) which must be emailed to mail@goldcoasteisteddfod.com.au.

There are standard Stage Plan set ups for other groups which include arrangement of equipment, percussion, chairs & stands which all groups must use. Rehearsal in the outlined format is strongly suggested.

String Orchestras may be Standing or Seated which must be noted upon entry.

CRITERIA

BANDS/ORCHESTRAS/STRING ORCHESTRAS

Primary Schools

A Grade - An advanced level of musicianship and instrumental skills. Recognised repertoire at Level 2 and above is expected

B Grade - A competent level of musicianship and instrumental skills. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 1.5 is expected

C Grade - A developing level of musicianship and instrumental skills. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 1 is expected

Novice - Students must have commenced learning their instrument in the current calendar year. Repertoire expected to be beginning concert band level and/or from Book 1 text

Secondary Schools

A Grade - An advanced level of musicianship and instrumental skills. A balanced instrumentation is encouraged. Recognised repertoire at Level 4 and above is expected.

B Grade - A competent level of musicianship and instrumental. A balanced instrumentation is encouraged but not essential. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 3.5 is expected

C Grade - A developing level of musicianship and instrumental skills. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 2 is expected

STAGE BANDS

Primary School – Standard stage band instrumentation and repertoire is expected.

Secondary School A Grade – An advanced level. Recognised repertoire Level 3.5 and above is expected

Secondary School B Grade – A competent level. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 3 is expected

Secondary School C Grade - A developing level. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 2 is expected

Any combination of string, wind, brass, percussion, keyboard instruments including recorder. Limit of TWO amplified instruments. Piano accompaniment by adults/teachers is permitted.

B002 PRIMARY SCHOOL AGE STRING INSTRUMENT ENSEMBLE YEARS 1 TO 6

Entry Fee: \$70.00

Time Limit: 5 minutes

5-15 players. A contrasting program. Competitors may not perform more than once unless playing a different instrument. It is not necessary for all members of a group to attend the same school. Any combination of stringed instruments. No percussion or amplified instruments. Piano accompaniment by adults/teachers is permitted.

Prizes: 1st Pam Lowry Trophy, 2nd & 3rd Trophies

B003 PRIMARY SCHOOL STRING ORCHESTRA OR ENSEMBLE - A GRADE YEARS 1 TO 6

Entry Fee: \$80.00

Time Limit: 12 minutes

A contrasting program. Minimum of 10 players. No students appearing in this section will be permitted to play in B, C Grades or Novice. String instruments only. No piano, amplification or percussion.

Prizes: 1st Limelight Multimedia Trophy, 2nd & 3rd Trophies

B004 PRIMARY SCHOOL STRING ORCHESTRA OR ENSEMBLE - B GRADE YEARS 1 TO 6

Entry Fee: \$80.00

Time Limit: 10 minutes

A contrasting program. Minimum of 10 players. No students appearing in this section will be permitted to play in A, C Grades or Novice. String instruments only. However, piano permitted if scored – may be played by student/teacher/adult. No amplification or percussion.

Prizes: 1st Gold Coast Philharmonic Orchestra Trophy, 2nd & 3rd Trophies

B005 PRIMARY SCHOOL STRING ORCHESTRA OR ENSEMBLE - C GRADE YEARS 1 TO 6

Entry Fee: \$80.00

Time Limit: 8 minutes

A contrasting program. Minimum of 10 players. No students appearing in this section will be permitted to play in A, B Grades or Novice. String instruments only. However, piano permitted if scored – may be played by student/teacher/adult. No amplification or percussion.

Prizes: 1st Dr Andrew Letchford: Orthopaedic Surgeon Trophy, 2nd & 3rd Trophies
