





ACCESSIBILITY

HOTA – For wheelchair users and people with mobility requirements there is a ramp that provides access from the street level to the terrace and HOTA Café, and then heading indoors there is a lift which will take you to the main foyer, Box Office and Theatre 1.

Guide Dogs and Assistance/Service Animals - your guide dog or registered assistance/service animal is more than welcome! Just let HOTA know you'll be bringing one when you book your tickets.

Theatre 1 Stage accessibility - whilst there are some challenges that HOTA face due to the age of the venue (ie access via BOH areas) HOTA staff are able to offer access for a range of requirements.

BROADBEACH CULTURAL PRECINCT - Access to Albert Water Ways Auditorium is via the front entrance of the building with no stairs. For access on stage there is a wheelchair lift.

ROBINA COMMUNITY CENTRE - Access to Robina Community Centre Auditorium is via the front entrance of the building with no stairs. For access on stage there is a wheelchair lift.

Access to the multipurpose room's has a ramp and all rooms we use are on the ground floor. Additional warm up room on the first level, access via the lift.

A.B. PATERSON - DAWN LANG PERFORMING ARTS CENTRE -

There is a ramp to provide access from the street level to the theatre entrance. Access into the theatre is from the entrance doors either side of the building, all the same floor level with space available for wheelchairs and mobility aids in the centre row.

GLOW CHURCH - Is a one level venue and seating in the auditorium is all one level. There is a ramp to access the stage from the auditorium.

ALL GROUPS - DANCE, BANDS & CHORAL - Must have two delegated marshalls for each group who will assist in the flow of the competition and supervise entering and exiting their performance.

We will require numbers in group when entering, along with Conductors name if applicable so we can ensure the smooth running of the event.

ALL Groups – there will be no access to 'holding' room for parents. This area is limited to performers, teachers and delegated marshalls. Bags are to be kept to a minimum.

Only hand held props i.e. the dancer must be able to carry the prop in their hands (chairs / benches will be allowed)

FEES - ADMINISTRATION & LATE

\$10 administration fee is charged and is non-refundable for each invoice/entry - this fee includes the electronic program emailed when completed mid-June. \$25 Late fee will be charged after the cut off date of entry and music upload.

GCE ARTISTIC DEVELOPMENT GRANT

Competitors aged 16 to 20 years as at January 1, 2024 are invited to apply for the Artistic Development Grants if they have won either two solo sections or one championship section in their chosen genre.

Entrants are to complete a written application after which one performer from each of the following will be chosen to receive a \$500 grant:

Dance | Vocal | Strings | Wind/Brass | Piano | Speech & Drama

Each winner must then submit an electronic performance to the Gold Coast Eisteddfod to then be submitted to a panel of judges to decide a winner who will receive a further \$1,000 and a runner up a further \$500.

By entering the Gold Coast Eisteddfod you agree to abide by the rules and regulations as outlined in this Syllabus. Gold Coast Eisteddfod's public liability does not comprehensively cover injury to performers, therefore individuals and schools must ensure that they are adequately covered whilst performing or otherwise enter at their own risk. By agreeing, you automatically grant permission for digital images or footage to be used for promotional or marketing purposes and/or social media.

If you do not agree please advise the Eisteddfod office in writing.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Unless otherwise stated, the Gold Coast Eisteddfod is for amateur performers only i.e. any person who does not derive nor has ever derived his or her main income or a substantial income as a teacher and/or performer in the particular category of performing arts for which he/she wishes to enter.
- 2. **Entries close: April 22, 2024, unless sold out prior.** Please submit entries as early as possible due to entry numbers being limited. Payment will be by PayPal or direct debit.
- 3. Enter online at www.goldcoasteisteddfod.com.au. No late entries. For assistance in entering please contact the office mail@goldcoasteisteddfod.com.au
- 4. It is the responsibility of the entrants, teacher, parent or carer to list the correct section numbers on entry. GCE accepts no responsibility for incorrect entries received.
- 5. Entry fees are not refundable unless the section is cancelled by GCE.
- 6. Unless otherwise stated, any item may be performed once only by a competitor and an entrant may only enter once in each section.
- 7. Time limits must be observed. These are the maximum an item may be shorter than the limit but not exceed it. Should time limits be exceeded, the adjudicator will penalise.
- 8. GCE reserves the right to cancel, combine or split any section/s.
- 9. GCE reserves the right to appoint a new adjudicator should it be deemed necessary.
- 10. Unless there are at least four competitors in a section, only one prize will be awarded, unless the adjudicator decides otherwise.
- 11. The decision of the adjudicator is final.
- 12. Prompting, except by an adjudicator is not permitted.
- 13. Intending competitors who have been pupils of an adjudicator within six months prior to Eisteddfod start date will be ineligible to enter any section judged by the adjudicator. (Workshops/Guest Teachers excluded)

14. Unless specifically invited by the adjudicator, contact must not be made directly by teachers, competitors or parents.

15. Photo & Video

- Mobile phones must be switched off in backstage and change room areas at all venues. No cameras allowed in these areas.
- Where there is no official operator, private recording is permitted only by the parent/representative or teacher of competitor on stage. No photography during a performance.
- 16. Any item having to withdraw after entering must notify GCE as soon as possible to ensure smooth programming.
- 17. Competitors must be present at the beginning of the session as withdrawals may alter the order of appearance. Due to this, it is unwise to anticipate exact performance times.
- 18. Any protest or objection must be referred to the Convenor of the section within 30 minutes of the Adjudicator's decision. A protest will only be accepted from a competitor, the competitor's teacher or parent and must be received with a \$50 fee. If the complaint is found to be valid, this fee will be refunded. In the case of a dispute arising in respect of the age of any competitor and their eligibility to appear in any age grouping, GCE reserves the right to request a copy of the birth certificate of that competitor. Anonymous letters will NOT be considered.
- 19. Every care will be taken for competitors' safety, but GCE will not be responsible for any injuries sustained by any competitor and or damage to property during the Eisteddfod.
- 20. Teachers please note there will be no additions to the program unless the omission is the fault of GCE.
- 21. GCE has the right to amend the program at any time.
- 22. Competitors and/or winner's names and/or photographs may be used in the media. Should this not be appropriate the Eisteddfod office MUST BE notified.
- 23. Failure to comply with any of the rules and regulations may result in disqualification or the withholding of prizes. The decision of GCE on any question or dispute shall be absolutely final.
- 24. All medals & trophies are provided by the Gold Coast Eisteddfod.
- 25. Time limit is calculated from first note played to the last note played including applause between items.
- 26. At the time limit stated, up to 15 seconds may be allowed to conclude the performance. It is NOT essential to play up to the time limit.
- 27. Penalties will be applied by the adjudicator if the performance is over the stated time limit.
- 28. Conductors should select the level of repertoire at the recommended level stated for each Grade which will best showcase this in their performance.
- 29. No student taking part in graded sections will be permitted to play in another grade unless playing a different instrument. Percussionists may play in one grade only unless otherwise specified.
- 30. A copy of music must be provided for the adjudicator, uploaded via GCE system.
- 31. No soloists in Concert Band, Orchestra, String Orchestra or Instrument Ensemble sections i.e. No concerto/concerto grosso repertoire.
- 32. To avoid program clashes a conductor must be nominated on entry together with numbers in each ensemble and whether string orchestras are standing or seated.
- 33. To avoid overcrowding on stage or backstage and to facilitate quick changeovers, competitors must use available instruments/equipment where these are provided.
- 34. All electrical requirements, including keyboard, amplifiers and power supplies, need to comply with Queensland Government regulations i.e. must have current electrical test and tag. Non-compliance will result in the equipment being disallowed.
- 35. For ALL BAND ENTRIES AT HOTA a maximum of 60 musicians (those with 50+ may be converted to virtual if required) and a maximum of 45 musicians at GLOW or otherwise stated using set stage plans.
 - 6. Students must attend the school they represent (unless otherwise stated).

- 37. Directors of groups must arrange for responsible adults with school ID to supervise members inside and outside the theatre.
- 38. Banners will be permitted for front row players only.
- 39. On stage preparation time must not exceed 4 minutes including set up and tuning.
- 40. Competitors must be in their allocated instrument storage / tuning room or allocated seating in the theatre prior to start time of their sections. Performers must stay together as a group for the duration of the session and are not permitted to join parents in the audience seating.
- 41. Instruments or belongings are not be left unattended except in allocated storage areas.
- 42. Teachers please note withdrawals and events beyond the control of the convenor may affect the running time of sections. All reasonable effort will be made to adhere to the program but the order of appearance may be changed without advance notice at the discretion of the convenor. Please advise parents only the section start time not anticipated performance time.
- 43. There may be some changes in dates and venues so please carefully check program when received and ensure program links are refreshed to receive the current information.

SET STAGE PLANS - MUST BE ADHERED TO AS THIS GIVES GCE ABILITY TO OFFER MAXIMUM ENTRIES

Rehearsal in the outlined format is necessary.

String Orchestras may be Standing or Seated in the set formation which must be noted upon entry.

All sheet music is to be uploaded via GCE system.

SECTION ENTRY NUMBERS WILL BE LIMITED. HOWEVER YOU DO HAVE THE OPTION OF COMPETING IN OUR VIRTUAL SECTIONS. FOR THESE, YOUR VIDEO WILL BE UPLOADED TO OUR SYSTEM BY THE BEGINNING OF TERM 3 AND ADJUDICATED DURING THIS YEAR'S GCE.

We are proud to continue offering virtual options for Bands, orchestras and instrumental groups. You will see some included in this syllabus - if other sections sell out prior to entries closing or group sizes too large to accommodate at venue we may add additional virtual sections and add entries to these sections. All virtual entries can be filmed anywhere and need to be one shot (no cuts). All who enter the virtual sections will receive an adjudication from one of our wonderful adjudicators!

MAXIMUM NUMBER OF 60 MUSICIANS @ HOTA SECTIONS UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED, HOWEVER ALL ENTRANTS OF 50+ MUST BE AWARE THAT DUE TO VENUE CAPACITIES THESE MAY BE CONVERTED TO VIRTUAL ENTRIES IF REQUIRED.

CRITERIA

BANDS/ORCHESTRAS/STRING ORCHESTRAS

Primary Schools

A Grade - An advanced level of musicianship and instrumental skills. Recognised repertoire at Level 2 and above is expected

B Grade - A competent level of musicianship and instrumental skills. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 1.5 is expected

C Grade - A developing level of musicianship and instrumental skills. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 1 is expected

Novice - Students must have commenced learning their instrument in the current calendar year. Repertoire expected to be beginning concert band level and/or from Book 1 text

Secondary Schools

A Grade - An advanced level of musicianship and instrumental skills. A balanced instrumentation is encouraged. Recognised repertoire at Level 4 and above is expected.

B Grade - A competent level of musicianship and instrumental. A balanced instrumentation is encouraged but not essential. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 3.5 is expected

C Grade - A developing level of musicianship and instrumental skills. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 2 is expected

STAGE BANDS

Primary School – Standard stage band instrumentation and repertoire is expected.

Secondary School A Grade – An advanced level. Recognised repertoire Level 3.5 and above is expected Secondary School B Grade – A competent level. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 3 is expected Secondary School C Grade - A developing level. Recognised repertoire up to and including Level 2 is expected

The Adjudicator will award First, Second & Third places along with allocating each competitor a rating of Platinum, Gold, Silver or Bronze (this will be marked on adjudication paper). The rating will be marked on the following performance aspects evaluated:

- Musicianship a responsiveness to style, expressiveness, the artistic rendering of the composer's intention and sense of ensemble.
- Technique addressing all technical demands in the score including intonation, production, accuracy,
 and the evident skill level of the performers
- Presentation this addresses the performers demeanour, the appropriate selection of repertoire, and an adherence to GCE requirements.

PLATINUM - 96-100% GOLD - 81-95% SILVER - 61-80% BRONZE - 45-60% Participation - up to 45%
